CLC 11 and Capstone 12 are courses required by the BC Ministry of Education for Grade 12 Graduation. Students not completing both courses by the required deadlines will not be eligible to graduate in June. **All** CLC 11 course assignments must be successfully completed in order to move on to the Capstone 12 course. Attendance is mandatory and will follow the dates as outlined by your teacher. During the CLC 11 portion of this year, we will be using MyBlueprint. If you have a personal computer device, you are encouraged to bring it to class.

Capstone 12 Overview & Goal

A capstone project is a project that will allow you to demonstrate your learning using an area(s) of interest as the basis for the project. Ideally, this would be in an area you are passionate about as you will spend a minimum of 40 hours working with this topic/area of interest. You will be designing, assembling and presenting a mini-capstone project to an audience to demonstrate **personal learning** and **achievement** (in and out-of-school) and **growth in the core competencies**.
